CHAPTER MEMBERS IN ACTION

Clinch River Bank Restoration Projects (Wright & Wolfenbarger properties): A grant application was submitted to the National Fish & Wildlife foundation by member, Buzz Buffington in conjunction with Alan Neal, Cumberland Mountain RC& D. and Mike Shoffner, NRCS. Project cost is estimated at \$37,150 with \$16,300 requested from NF&WF and \$20,850 in matching contributions. If approved, work could start in March to reshape banks, build cattle fences and plant grass, shrubs and trees.

STORM WATER PERMIT TASKFORCE

Members Buzz Buffington, Berny Ilgner and Barry Thacker joined Anderson County representatives and ARCADIS Consulting to develop a NPDES Phase II Storm water Permit for Anderson County, one of the first counties to be involved. This State wide program permits rural counties to implement protection programs in their urbanizing areas: public education & outreach, public participation, illicit discharge detection & elimination, construction, on-going & post runoff control and pollution prevention. Remember those 6000 tires, appliances and indefinable trash that we have removed? County Exec Rex Lynch estimated that efforts under this Permit will save \$30,000-\$40,000 annually.

THE ANGLER'S CORNER

Controlling the Strike - a main reason for missing a rising fish stems from faulty reactions: we are either too fast and forceful (most frequent problem) or too slow. A *deliberate strike* will invariably hook a good sized fish.

Usually our reactions are based on the day's fishing. If trout rise noticeably and frequently we may have a few false moves in the beginning which are quickly overcome. However, on an off day we get several strikes from small fish, become nervous and strike with a quickness and forcefulness that emphasizes the "release" side of fishing. A deliberate strike involves the simple raising of the wrist or forearm bringing the power of the rod taunt against the pull of the fish.

The larger the fish the more careful the strike must be.
